NEW PREFAB FOR JUNIOR II CLASS:

Lorrell's Junior II pupils have settled into the new prefab and they are really loving the enormous space and their

own playground. We will be developing some outdoor apparatus for Lorrell's big boys to use during break times, but cannot make a start on this until the prefab skirting has been installed. A traverse climbing wall is the first item, and then more to follow. We have a wonderful donation from the Rotary Anns (Hibiscus Coast) for this specific purpose. A big thanks once again to M Projects for so generously donating the prefab classroom. A lot was achieved during the school holidays to get the classroom and



playground ready for the start of term and we are so grateful for, and proud of how it has turned out.



BUILDING EXTENSION:

The foundations and slab for our new building were laid before the builders' holidays in December. Since construction was resumed in January, the work has progressed at a rapid rate, and we are nearing completion of this lovely large room.

We have decided to use this room as a multipurpose room ie for music, baking/cooking, Lego club, assemblies, small group/individual tutoring, visiting speakers, teachers' courses, etc. We are looking forward to setting it and up and being able to make use of the space.

DONORS:

We are truly grateful for the generosity of the two donors who gave financial assistance to make this building possible - for their support of our school and the faith that they have placed in our vision and the need for a school such as ours in this area.



We have also had support and generous assistance from a few local companies and private business owners who have been involved in the above two projects which we have undertaken, by supplying materials at reduced costs. VOLUNTEERS:

<u>DENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMME</u>: Christa Nightingale is continuing to support the teachers as they implement a dental health programme in our school. In January she delivered, on behalf of the KZN Department of Health, new toothbrushes and toothpaste for each child. Many of our pupils struggle with this daily routine for various reasons, and by providing the programme at school, we hope to reinforce your efforts to encourage healthy dental care at home.

Christa came to perform a dental check on each pupil at school on Wednesday 17th February. The children were extremely cooperative and even enthusiastic, giving Christa a chance to examine each child thoroughly. Those children who need further attention would have received a letter to this effect. If your child was absent on that day, please speak to Sheryl regarding a special examination next time Christa visits our school.

LEGO TRAINING: We have had our introductory Lego training which has been sponsored by the LEGO Foundation who donated our incredible stock of LEGO and DUPLO. The LEGO trainer was able to come to the school last week Tuesday for a 2 hour session which we enjoyed immensely. We learnt so much about how to use LEGO in the classroom, and have already started to implement the ideas at school. We look forward to the follow-up session which we will have soon.

SPEECH THERAPY:

Unati Kamanga has started therapy sessions with some of our pupils on Wednesday mornings here at school. Unati was trained at UCT and gained great experience in the Cape, in particular at the renowned Children's Red Cross Hospital in Cape Town. She gives special rates to Cornerstone pupils. Cash payments are in advance, but claims can be made to medical aid. Please speak to Sheryl for further information.

Olivia Luke will continue to provide Occupational Therapy on Monday mornings to pupils whose parents require this service – please let us know if you would like your child to have occupational therapy at school.

OTHER NEWS:

We were given a cheque from the Catholic Women's League (Margate) at the end of last year – this has been used to purchase the new trampoline in our playground (the old one has had its net removed and is being used by the older boys on their new playground), as well as the gazebo which we will only be using on hot summer days.

Thanks to Angelique Bennie who donated the proceeds of school photos to the preschool class - this was used to buy a water cooler with tap for the children to use in the garden, encouraging our children to drink water especially on hot days.
